
Rocky Mountain Canoe Club State of the Paddling Union for 2019

Annual Meeting

Our annual meeting – held November 2_{nd} and attended by about 35 – included our traditional pot luck, several slide presentations wrangled by Jeff Keeler and representing club and extra-club paddles, and reports by the officers on membership, the website that just migrated to a new host (www.rockymountaincanoeclub.NET), trips, instruction, club equipment, and finances. We also elected new officers and discussed some ideas for 2020 activities, including conservation projects, dragon boat racing, and trips!

A highlight of the meeting was presentation of our first, and perhaps annual, Conservation Award – The Otter – to Wildlands Restoration Volunteers. Sarah Egolf-Tarr, the WRV Development Director, accepted the plaque and \$500 check and talked about WRV's work with a focus on their river restoration projects. Thanks to Conservation Award Committee members Bill Ashworth, Lindsay Meeks, and G Winter for designing the award selection process and implementing it for us.

2019 Activities:

Largely due to our 22 enthusiastic and generous – not to mention talented – trip and event coordinators, we had a successful year with a total of 29 activities, including canoe instruction classes, meetings/parties, and 18 paddling trips. Seven events were cancelled due to high water, wind, or too few committed participants.

For our 2019 trips and events, we totaled 380 participants, which is another record total since Bill Ashworth started keeping track in 2011. See the historical comparison below and the summary chart at the end for more detail.

Paddling:

The 18 paddling trips included:

- 10 in Colorado and 8, at least partially, out-of-state
- 7 day trips and 11 multi-day trips
- 4 flatwater and 14 river trips

New club trips this year were the Everglades and Okefenokee Swamp and Suwannee River in GA/FL and Standley Lake in Westminster. Old favorites included the Niobrara (NE), Green River (UT) and North and South Platte (CO and WY) paddles.

2020 trips are already being scheduled!

Instruction:

2019 instruction included three free pool classes (Brace-and-Roll, Rescue, and Stroke Techniques) and a two-day Canoeing Essentials class, taught and coordinated by ACA-certified instructors Debbie Hinde, Lynne Carpenter, Jeff Oxenford, and Alyse Oxenford with help from several other members.

New classes this year included a lecture/discussion on river access issues by Professor Mark Squillace from the CU Law School, a set of webinars on water use, organized by Mike Johnson, and Canoeing Cuisine, organized by Kit Williams and taught by Karen Amundson, Bill Ashworth, Lynne Carpenter, Dan Custer, and Kit and Henry Williams. Membership:

Membership stayed constant with 124 households with 187 members, although we welcomed several new and returning members to the club. Membership chairman, Bill Ashworth, compiled and distributed an electronic roster in the fall including all members who did not opt-out of the roster. Members who joined late in 2019 were added to the roster, but their dues will be applied to 2020.

RMCC members are encouraged to join ACA and ACA members are encouraged to sign the ACA on-line waiver to avoid having to sign waivers at each event.

Finances:

The club continues to be financially sound. Treasurer Kathy Ashworth reports a net loss of \$601.17 with an ending balance of \$7,000.74. The majority of our income was from membership dues and the remainder from registration fees for the Canoeing Essentials class. The majority of our expenses were for event expenses, including our instruction program, the Otter Award (\$500), the internet, and ACA dues.

Website:

This year, webmaster Dan Custer shepherded our website to a new host (GoDaddy) and new .net url — www.rockymountaincanoeclub.net (due to trouble with the old host). He also added a couple of new pages (Instruction and Conservation), reorganized a bit, and improved both the Trip Reports and Photo Gallery (under the Posts tab). Dan plans on some more additions in 2020 and welcomes comments, notices of broken links, and any other help you want to offer. If you want them uploaded, send him trip reports and photos of both RMCC and personal paddling trips.
