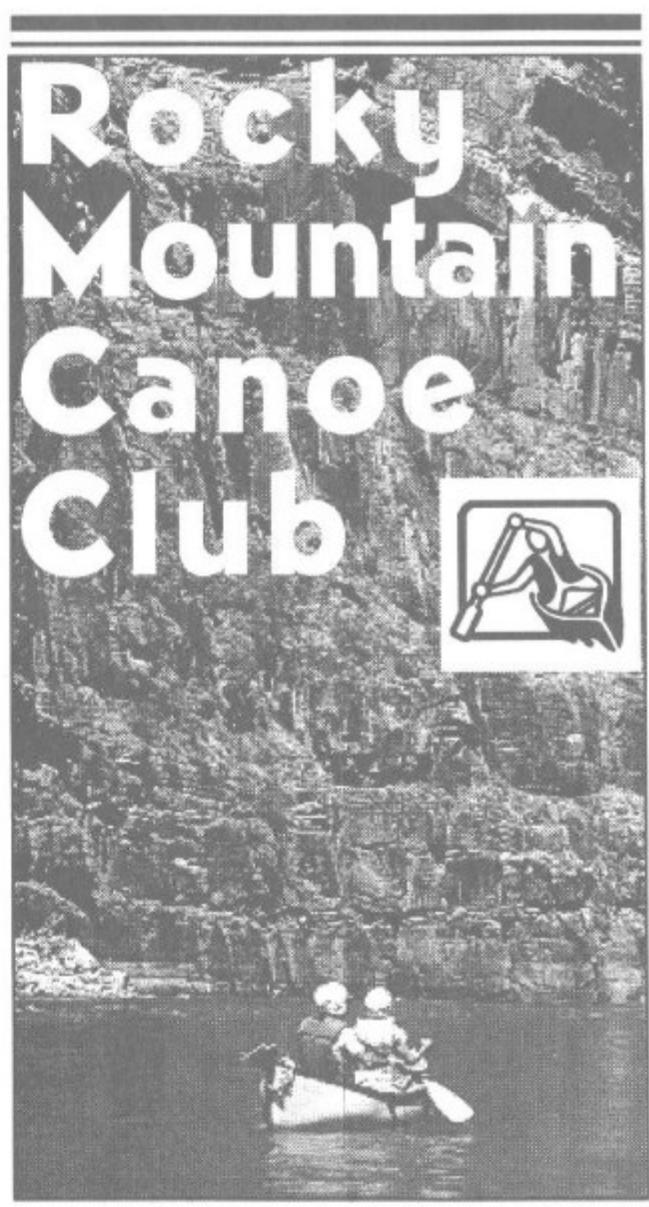

The Rocky Mountain Canoe Club is a club for paddlers—paddlers of all manner of craft, but primarily canoes. The RMCC was founded by a few eccentric pioneers from Boulder in 1975 as a means to safely enjoy our rivers and meet other boaters.

Today the membership is about 300+ households strong, and the purposes

of the RMCC remain unchanged. Paddling activities are planned throughout the year, with summer being the most active period.

The RMCC offers opportunities for everyone from the novice to expert levels. There are trips available to fit every level of experience, from easy moving water floats to advanced level whitewater, both

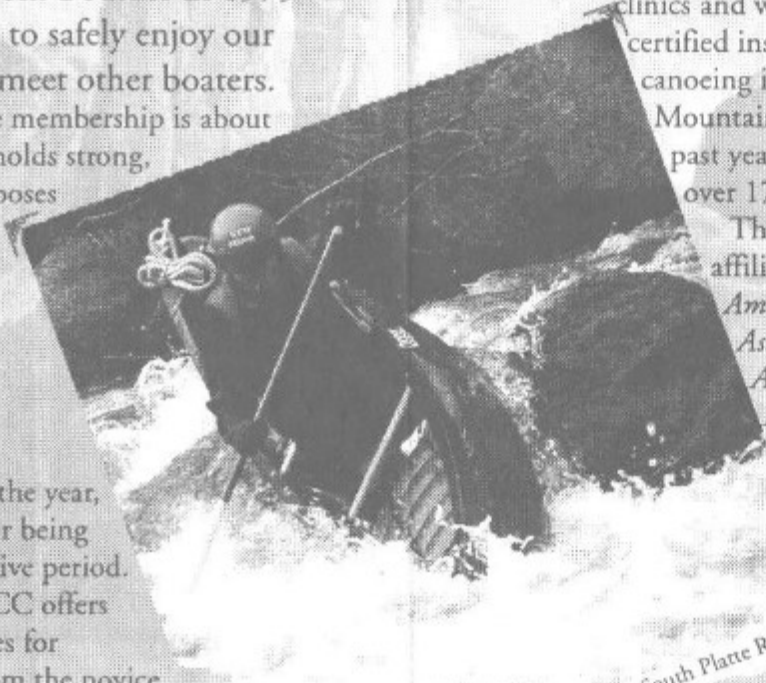
in the Denver Metro area as well as the greater Rocky Mountain region. Our members also regularly travel outside of this region to other states and countries, for both recreational and competitive events. We offer opportunities for families as well as single or tandem boaters. Each spring we offer free safety clinics and we have the oldest certified instruction school for canoeing in the Rocky Mountain region. In the past year we have taught over 175 students.

The Club is affiliated with the American Canoe Association, the American Whitewater Affiliation, and American Rivers. We are active in river clean-up and conservation activities.

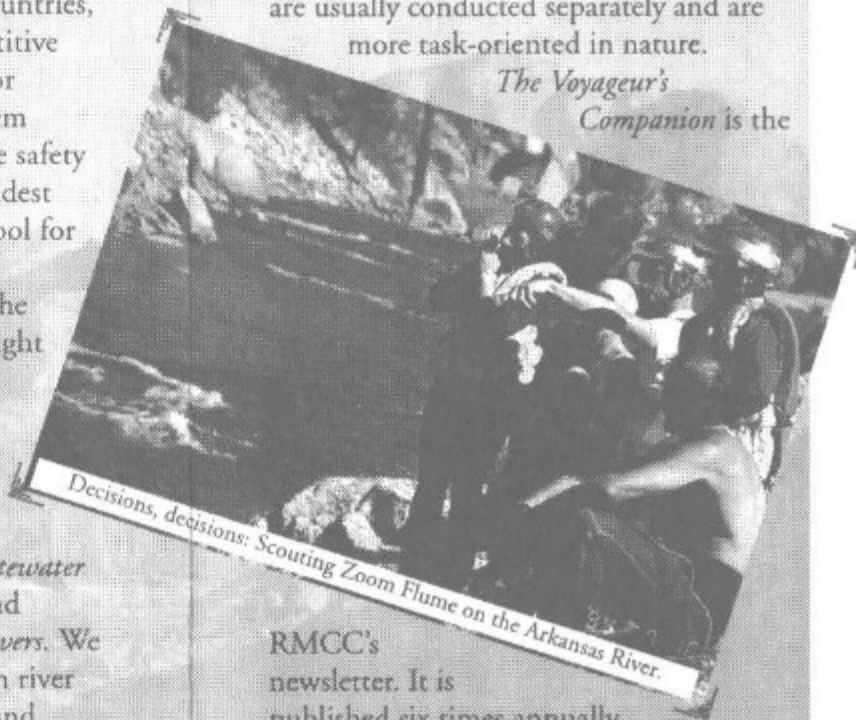
We have four meetings each year, primarily social in nature, featuring pot-luck dinners that celebrate the season's paddling adventures through the sharing of slides or video records. These meetings also offer

members the opportunity to share stories and meet new friends, to make plans and even to sell or buy gear. Business meetings are usually conducted separately and are more task-oriented in nature.
